Assumptions Based on Previous Committee Discussion

Cost is a factor. What savings can be projected to make any of the choices reasonable on a cost basis? External factors may influence outcomes: court decisions, ballot measures such as requirement for jungle primary Minimal change to the current system would be preferable. Goals are governing effectiveness and responsiveness to the community. Ways to increase voter participation should be considered.
